Concept note

It is an inevitable part in the field of Indology and historiography. Manuscriptology provides a fascinating area for exercising palaeography, calligraphy and museology. A manuscript deals with structural analysis of elements related to the visual and aesthetic qualities. This course is designed with a goal to provide students basic idea of the rich manuscript heritage of Indian sub-continent.

30 Hours (17.02.2020 – 06.03.2020, 8 a.m. to 10 a.m.)

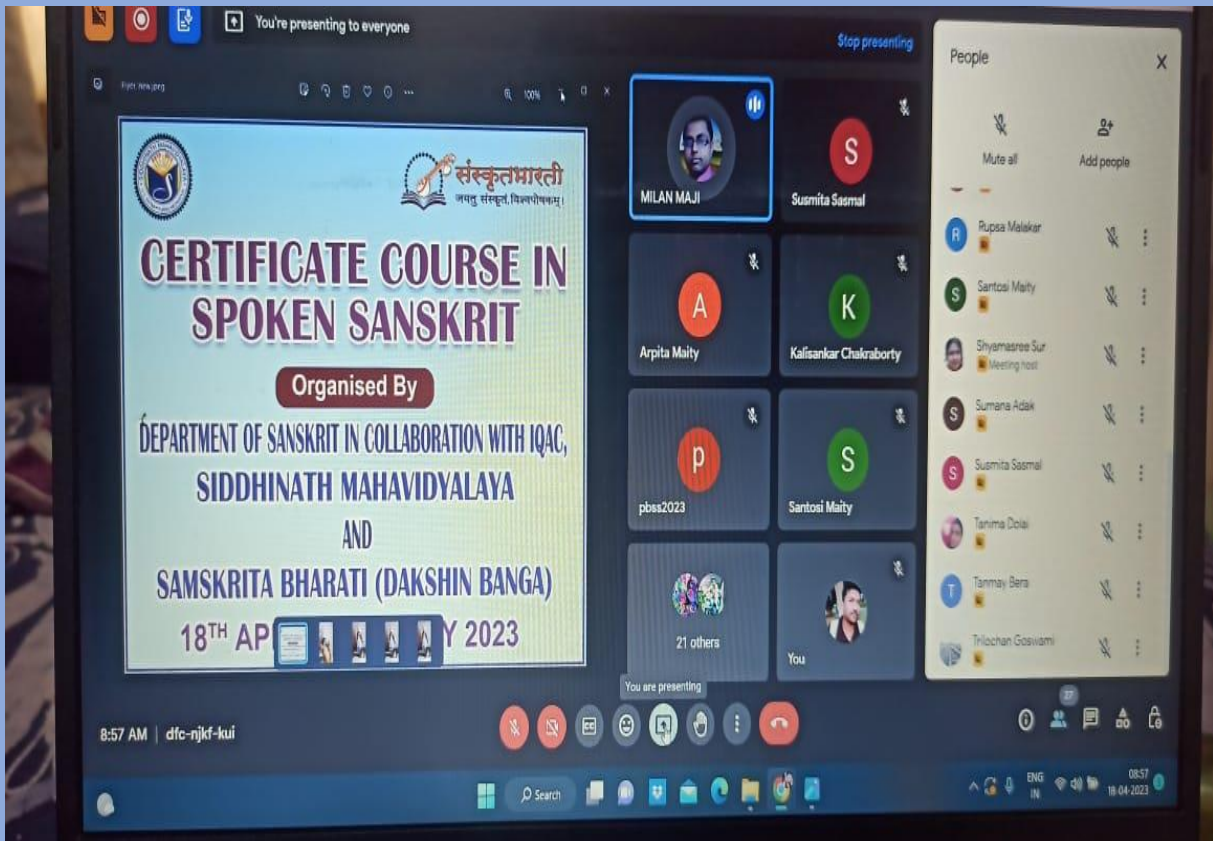
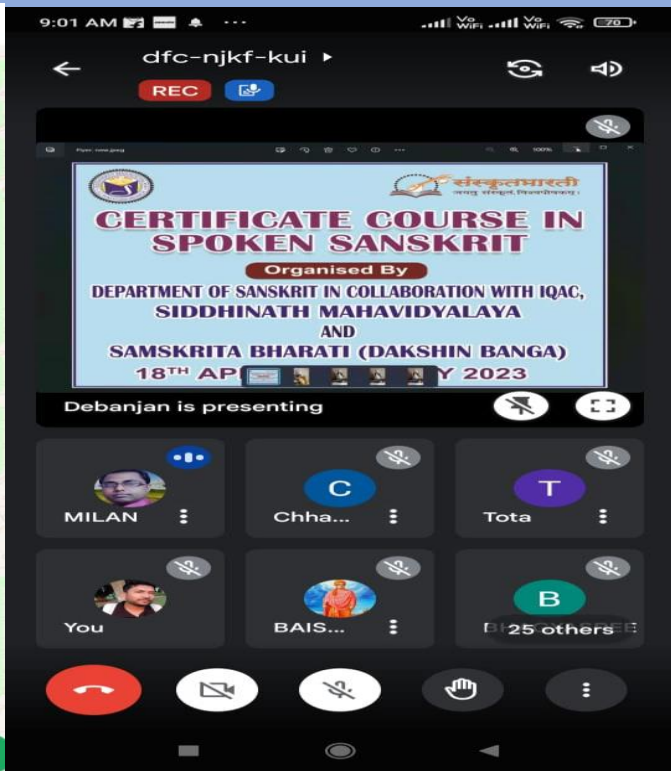
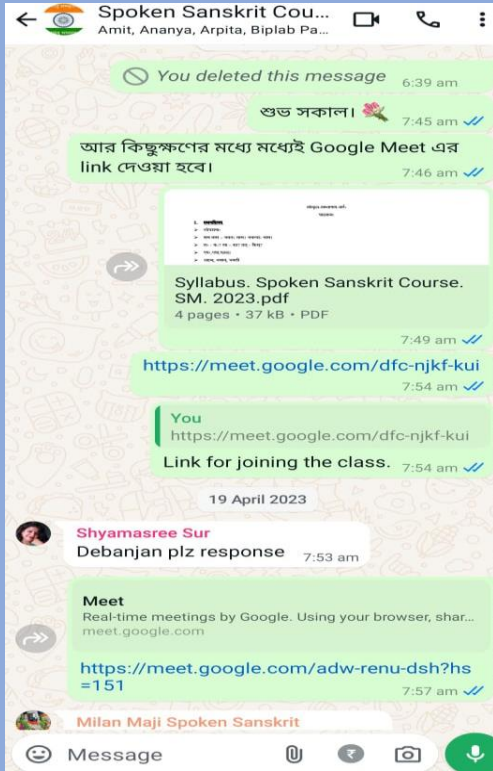
